1	SECTION 1. SENSE OF CONGRESS ON POLITICALLY MOTI-
2	VATED DETENTIONS AND HUMAN RIGHTS
3	ABUSES IN THE MALDIVES.
4	(a) FINDINGS.—Congress makes the following find-
5	ings:
6	(1) The Maldives is strategically important due
7	to its location, which straddles major trade routes in
8	the Indian Ocean.
9	(2) Increasing human rights violations in the
10	Maldives fuel instability and pose a threat to re-
11	gional security.
12	(3) Since January 2015, President Abdulla
13	Yameen of the Maldives has increasingly cracked
14	down on dissent within his own party and the polit-
15	ical opposition, presided over the erosion of judicial
16	impartiality, and put increasing pressure on civil so-
17	ciety.
18	(4) The arrest of former President Mohamed
19	Nasheed in March 2015 was widely condemned as
20	politically motivated, and his conviction and sentence
21	of 13 years in prison has been condemned by Am-
22	nesty International as a "travesty of justice".
23	(5) In his speech in Sri Lanka on May 2, 2015,
24	Secretary of State John Kerry stated, "[W]e've seen
25	even now how regrettably there are troubling signs
26	that democracy is under threat in the Maldives

where the former President Nasheed has been imprisoned without due process. And that is an injustice that must be addressed soon."

- (6) On September 14, 2015, in his opening statement at the 30th session of the United Nations Human Rights Council, United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights Zeid Ra'ad said, "In the Maldives, the rule of law continues to be manipulated for political ends." He also stated, in reference to former President Mohamed Nasheed's detention, "Given the deeply tainted nature of this case, I urge the Government to release him, and to review several hundred pending criminal cases against opposition supporters in relation to protests in recent months."
