

Military Construction Projects Diverted for Border Wall – Schools and a day care

The Department of Defense has slated 11 projects – 10 school replacements and a child development center – totaling \$572 million to contribute to less than 23 miles of border wall. Through the Department of Defense Education Activity (DoDEA), DoD constructs, maintains, and operates a network of schools on military installations around the world for activity duty military and DoD civilian families. These schools – ranging from pre-K to 12th grade – ensure that service members who PCS in the U.S. or abroad are able to ensure their children receive access to quality education. Because of limited funding, many of these schools were constructed 40 or more years ago and have received little sustainment and modernization resources since. As such the internal systems (plumbing, electrical, HVAC, etc) are often in failing or failed condition.
